Starting Early in A Tough Market

Beginning a new year always comes with a good amount of optimism but also uncertainty. That seems to have been a recurring theme since the beginning of 2020. However, I'm happy to say we had a great fall season in terms of getting fertilizer down at both a local and co-op level. It's always a great feeling to finish the season on a high note.

As we head into the spring season, it's important to know the current trends of the market. Recently, it's been volatile when it comes to the price of nutrients. For example, the price of urea has increased by almost \$100 per ton. This comes from a shortage of natural gas overseas, causing shortages of product and putting an upward pressure on the price. Additionally, new import tariffs were placed on all phosphate products including P, K and potash effectively raising the price by nearly \$200 per ton.

Luckily, our domestic producers were able to fill the gap. Although we found success in the fall, relying heavily on our domestic products ate through a lot of the stored product. Increases in nutrient prices have also led to an increase in crop prices. It's hard to say whether or not the market will calm down any time soon.

Looking ahead, remember that putting in your application requests as early as possible will give you the best chance to fulfill your needs. With a lack of snow this winter, I'm anticipating a head start on fertilizer application sometime mid-March. Getting P and K down as early as possible will allow for a smoother planting season.
